Closer: This is the last song of the set. This will be the final song and sound you leave your audience with. What do you want them going away feeling or thinking? How can you help make that happen with a specific song?

Other Considerations: How do different songs flow into each other? What are the high and low energy songs? Will certain songs sound good or back next to each other?



IEC Cable - Used to power many electronics on stage, such as monitors and amplifiers
