

Hip Hip Basics: Give Me a Word



Objective

Students will create their own original raps by improvising based off of a given word.

Resources

- 1. Visit https://relatedwords.org/ for ideas on how to associate words with each other.
- 2. Watch this video of Lin-Manuel Miranda freestyling on the Jimmy Kimmel Show.

Key Terms

Bar - A measure of music, typically four beats long.

Procedures

- 1. Students will watch Coach Kenrick freestyle as he is given words to integrate into his rap.
- 2. Students will be given one word at a time that they must incorporate into their own freestyle rap. The words include: "city, traffic, paper, love, clouds, guitar, noise, and day."
- 3. Students will work in pairs. Student A will provide words for Student B, who will then freestyle over a rap or hip-hop beat. Students will then switch places and Student A will improvise the rap while Student B provides the words to incorporate. Students will repeat this process as needed in order to establish comfort with rapping using the Give Me a Word activity.
- 4. To create easier or more challenging versions of this activity, student who are struggling and use beats with a slower tempo, and students who are excelling and use one with a faster tempo. Students can also rap on every other measure to give them more time to prepare.

Extension

- 1. Students can expand on this activity individually by writing random words on flashcards. When the music starts, they can flip one card over at a time and begin improvising lyrics.
- 2. Students can also use a **Word Generator** to generate words that they can incorporate into their own freestyle.
