

Lesson Plan: Let's Groove!



Objective

Students will play the backbeat and its common variations.

Resources

Beat Graphics on Jam Zone

Online Metronome

Lesson/Unit Outline

- 1. Watch video one as a class. Practice the coordination in this order:
 - a. Vocalize the drumbeat
 - b. Both hands
 - c. Left hand (snare drum) and right foot (bass drum)
 - d. Back to both hands, then adding in the foot

*Note: this sequence is not required, but typically helps students to be successful.

- 2. Find a song to play along to.
- 3. Students practice playing each beat. They can choose to play along with:
 - a. A metronome at the speed of their own choosing
 - b. A song that is an appropriate tempo
- 4. Students demonstrate for each other, in pairs or larger groups.
- 5. Students record a beat of their choice with a backing track (either a metronome or a song)

Extensions and Next Steps

1. Students can compose their own drum beats. They can add a snare drum or bass drum hit to the backbeat grid, and see how it sounds.

2. Students can share songs that they think use the backbeat or a similar variation. Listen together with the class and see if you can transcribe and play the beat. If the song is on the JamZone, it will have a suggested drum pattern.

- 3. Little Kids Rock has a large library of drumming concepts for drumset. Students can explore:
 - a. Building their own "junk drumset" and playing along.
 - b. Applying full drumset videos to their junk drumset. Try these units:
 - i. Basic Drum Grooves
 - ii. Drum Fills
 - iii. Drum Beat Composition
